Reeves wants teacher pay raise

Gov. Tate Reeves proposed raising teacher pay and eliminating the state's income tax in his Thursday morning speech at Founders Square.

Reeves called for an immediate \$1,300 a year across-the-board teacher pay raise followed by a \$1,000 per year raise in each of the next two years.

Reeves said he supports the teacher pay raise for the efforts teachers put in during the past year and a half of the COVID-19 pandemic and eliminating the income tax because Mississippi's workforce excelled through the pandemic and contributed to a robust economy.

"If we are successful in getting this done," Reeves said of the teacher pay raise, "this addi-

tional \$3,300 a year on top of the \$1,000 a year raise we did this year will result in Mississippi going from 37th nationally to 21st (in teacher pay)."

Reeves said despite the pandemic teachers performed better than teachers in other states.

"Mississippi has led the entire nation in education over the last year," Reeves said. "While teachers in some other states kept kids chained to laptops or smartphones and pretended it was school, Mississippi insisted on in-person instruction. Other states said, 'We can't,' but Mississippi teachers said, 'Yes we can.' And they did it."

Reeves said that as a result of the hard work, Mississippi was recently ranked first in the nation for fourth-grade reading improvement over the last three years and first in the nation in fourthgrade math improvement over the last three years.

"The Biden Administration likes to throw around the term 'equity," Reeves said. "Well, here in Mississippi both black and white students from low-income homes have achieved higher scores than the national average When the pandemic hit, our teachers knew that we could not afford to give up that momentum. They knew that our kids needed to get all of the instruction that we could give them."

Reeves said he has never been more proud to be a Mississippian several times throughout his 15-minute speech noting the difficulties his administration has faced throughout the past year and a half, including the COVID-19 pandemic.

He credited Mississippians with pulling the

Happy Hollow founders have fond memories

Two original cabin owners in Happy Hollow are still enjoying the Fair every year.

Jane Cole and Tom Petty have been coming to the Fair since the 1950s.

"We named it the Happy Hollow because we're all so happy, I guess!" Cole said.

Petty built his cabin himself in 1961 with \$300 worth of materials. According to David Petty, Tom Petty's son, Tom built the cabin for his wife, Robbie, who dearly loved the Fair

Back then, Happy Hollow had a podium up at the front of the little street of cabins, which acted as a guest register for people to sign when they walked in. Happy Hollow also once featured a big outhouse, which everyone was perfectly happy to see go.

Cole came the year before she married her to-be husband and ate with him underneath the trees.

"That was my introduction: hot and dusty," she said. "Red dirt just covered you. But all of my memories have been good, because of my friends."

When the Fair flooded and the Happy Hollow was awash in red mud and water, Cole and her family remember children swimming and diving happily in their makeshift river.

Another harrowing story Cole shares is how her son Tim Cole got lost on the Fair-grounds when he was a child. Another cabin was meant to be watching him while his family went to see Jerry Lee Lewis perform, but when they came back, he was gone. Eventually, he was found in the grandstand, fast asleep on the bleachers, inches from falling through the bleachers' gaps.

"Scary, scary!" Cole said.

Many of these memories and incidents were recorded in Happy Hollow's own little newspaper production, years ago when family members took it upon themselves to keep the Happy Hollow residents up-to-date on the goings-on.

Cole remembers when Ray Howard played the trumpet for the Happy Hollow residents, waking everyone up in the dawn hours or playing in the evenings so Fairgoers could come dance in the Happy Hollow street.

"When the Saints Come Marching In" was a frequent hit. Cole was fond of the gospel singers who sang in the Pavilion in those days. Music and laughter have yet to slow in Happy Hollow.

state through the crisis and said that throughout the pandemic Missis-sippi's economy thrived.

"Last year during 2020 we saw \$1.9 billion in new capital investment in our state," Reeves said. "To put that into perspective, in the previous 10 years before I was governor, Mississippi averaged approximately \$900 million per year. We did twice as good during 2020 than in the previous 10 years and we plan to do even better in the years to come."

Why? Reeves asked.

"The major reason is you, our workforce," Reeves said. "You attracted that investment. You created those jobs. You really are second to none, and I'm committed to making sure our state invests back in you."

Reeves then proposed eliminating the state income tax, saying the economic growth was good for the state's coffers.

"Mississippi just ended our fiscal year having a budget a billion dollars more than was originally anticipated," Reeves said. "This is because while the rest of the country shut down we reopened."

Reeves said Mississippi reopened faster than many other states.

"I didn't do the hard work," Reeves said. "You know who did? You did. You woke up. You went to work. You provided for your family and you helped move our state ahead. In my view, because of that, you should reap the rewards. You should keep more of your paycheck. You're the reason why we are in the financial shape that we are in and that is why I stand before you today to propose once and for all that we eliminate the state income tax in Mississippi."

Other speakers throughout the day included Mississippi Auditor Shad White, Attorney General Lynn Fitch and Mississippi House Speaker Phillip Gunn.



"I eat what's in the cabin. We have good cooks here, so that's no problem," he said.


Once a Fair, however, everyone eats out on the Midway to get the full Fair experience.


For Wilbanks, this usually includes Penn's and the lemonade stand, which always hits the spot in the Mississippi summer heat.

Tucker has 7 decades of Fair memories

"I've been coming to the Fair since Jesus was a boy," said Lelia Brewer Tucker of Cabin 281. Her bragging rights come from 70-plus years of attendance at the Fair.

Tucker remembers the water pump by the Pavilion and what it was like to fetch water and bring it back to the cabin. She also remembers what it was like to rely on outhouses and outdoor privies.

These days, the Fair is a little more accommodating. Cabin 281 is her family's second cabin, and it has three stories, expanded for their growing family. This newer cabin also includes a big second story porch, which provides a beautiful bird's eye view of the harness and horse races.

Tucker has many memories of the horse races, thanks to her cabin's view. She remembers Charlie Wayne Therrell, the horse racing announcer and "the voice" of the Fair, who stayed in a cabin not far from Tucker's. Therrell and his brother once owned a horse who ran in the harness races and collapsed on the Racetrack. That horse was buried with a memorial in the middle of the Racetrack.

Tucker also remembers the Quarter Horses who ran on the Racetrack, who, without the fence between them and the ditch beneath Cabin 281, occasionally ran into the ditch and had to be fished back out. "But they've gotten everything fixed here, now," Tucker said.

These days, Tucker and her family get their Fair foods from the Williams Brothers store. "They supply us with our meats," Tucker said. "We used to feed the whole Fair when we cooked dinner."

Tucker's memories of 70 years of the Fair make for great stories, and with her growing family and accommodating cabin, there will be plenty of memories to make in the years to come.

AMAZING BUFFALO DIP

Ingredients:

2 cups diced cooked chicken

1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened

½ cup blue cheese salad dressing

½ cup hot pepper sauce (such as Frank's RedHot)

½ cup crumbled blue cheese

1/4 ranch dressing, or to taste

Stir chicken, cream cheese, blue cheese dressing, hot pepper sauce, crumbled blue cheese, and ranch dressing together in a slow cooker. Cook in the slow cooker on high until heat through, about 20 minutes.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Stir in the cream cheese, sour cream, pepperoni, and green chilies together in a baking dish. Bake in the preheated oven until thoroughly heated, about 30 minutes.

SPINACH DIP

An unbaked spinach dip. Unlike many other spinach dips this one is served deliciously cold. Enjoy! You can replace the red bell pepper with minced carrot or cucumber, or try using a combination of the three.

Ingredient Checklist

- 1 (10 ounce) package frozen chopped spinach, thawed
 - 1 cup minced onion
 - 2 cloves garlic, minced
 - 1 cup minced red bell pepper
 - ½ cup sour cream

- - ½ cup mayonnaise
 - 1 teaspoon ground cumin
 - ½ teaspoon salt

Squeeze the water out of the spinach, and place the spinach into a mixing bowl. Stir in the onion, garlic, vegetables, sour cream, mayonnaise, and cumin. Season with salt and pepper. Let the dip stand at room temp for 1/2 hour for the flavors to mix,

and stir again before serving. This dip keeps well in the fridge, covered, for up to 1 week.





The store was a place for people to buy groceries, gas, hardware, have their oil and tires changed and a place for people to gather for discussions. It would be open from sun-up to sundown seven days a week.

Ross Ford ran a milk route throughout Neshoba County. Kent Ford recalled that his dad made sure everyone got their milk fresh.

"When he got out of the truck he would just hop out of the Ford truck with it still running, drop off the milk

and keep going," Kent said. Romana Ford, daughter of Ross, said people running for office would visit the store to discover what the Ford's thought.

"People would make their appearance to find out what Ross and Chet thought about it because they could put the word or squash it fast," Romana said.

BJ was the oldest brother who would sit outside of the store and could spot anyone who would try to steal from the store. His spot was also the place where 10 to 15 men would sit around and discuss politics.

Grant Ford, the grandson of Ross, recalls as a child listening to older men sit around and talk politics.

"All these old guys would sit on the nail kegs and talked about everything while I'm getting an RC Cola and Moonpie," Grant Ford said.

The Ford Store helped support the community by letting people buy on credit until they received their paychecks. They were so well respected that the business actually incurred zero bad debt when the brothers retired and sold the store, family mem-
